## ➤ Commemoration of Formation of Kerala State



- A morning assembly was held in the foyer to commemorate the formation of the State of Kerala on the 1<sup>st</sup> of November, 2021. Ms. Kanaka Sathy Nair, the Principal lit the lamp and delivered the keynote address. The Malayalam Department presented a programme in line with the All India Radio presentation which included anecdotes, patriotic songs, historical accounts of Kerala and skits. The programme depicted the scenic, cultural and secular beauty of the state. ## ► School Re-opening

- As part of the nationwide lockdown and the mandatory closure of all educational institutions across the country to contain the spread of Covid 19 pandemic, the students and teachers have been left with no option other than digital learning since March 2020. The Kerala Govt.'s announcement to reopen the schools on Nov.1, 2021 was wholeheartedly received by The Sobha Academy as a sign to ameliorate the risk of loss of educational opportunities for all its students.
- Elaborate arrangements were made by the school to welcome all its students back to school after a gap of one year and a half. All the students were warmly welcomed by Ms. Kanaka Sathy Nair, the Principal, Ms. Deepa S C, the Vice- Principal and Ms. Lalitha Makesh, the Headmistress. The school entrance was elegantly decorated to create a feel at home environment for the students.
- Teachers greeted the students section-wise and arranged various programmes like mime, characterization, skit and discourses to spread the message of Covid protocols. The school started with all the students of class 10, 11 and 12 reporting to school every day and those of class 1 to 7 with alternate model of attendance i.e. weekly two day schooling. Classes for 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> resumed from Nov.15.

The examinations were conducted from 16<sup>th</sup> November, 2021 to 30<sup>th</sup> December, 2021. 98 students including 19 from St.Mary's School Mangalamdam in X and 27 in XII appeared for the examinations from our centre.
- Each day, after the conduct of examinations, spot evaluation was conducted and the marks were uploaded on the CBSE website. The parcel of answer scripts was dispatched to CBSE Regional Office at Thiruvananthapuram through postal services, as insured speed post. Ms. Kanaka Sathy Nair, the Principal was appointed as the Controller of the examinations and Ms. Bindhu from BVM Mannapra as the Observer.

## ▶ Human Rights Day
